

Herefordshire ceramics type fabric series (Romano-British pottery found in Herefordshire)

Greyware

Hard: A fine sandy ware with moderate quartz grains less than 0.1mm, sparse white specks. Wheel-thrown pottery 1st to early 3rd century (also late 4th).
