

Herefordshire ceramics type fabric series (Romano-British pottery found in Herefordshire)

New Forest mortaria

A hard sandy white or off-white fabric; occasionally with pale grey core; - late 3rd to late 4th centuries. It was produced in the area of what is now the New Forest and is widely distributed in southern England, occurring with decreasing frequency beyond.¹
