

Herefordshire ceramics type fabric series (Romano-British pottery found in Herefordshire)

Trier Rhenish ware

Very hard, fine-textured fabric produced in the Trier area in 2nd and 3rd centuries. Widely distributed in lower Germany and Britain

Rare locally, although pot of this type has been found outside Kenchester (Magnis) in 1977 – 1979.¹
