FIELD MEETING No. 2

SATURDAY 17 MAY 2025

On this expedition to the Cwmyoy area, Alan Bowring will introduce members to the landscape of the southern end of the Vale of Ewyas or 'Llanthony Valley'. Though mainly active in the Palaeozoic, the Neath Disturbance continues to shape this landscape. Quaternary glaciations and landslides have re-shaped it, and our ancestors have left their mark too, not least during the Iron Age, and we will visit Gaer hillfort, St Martin's Church and the Graig at Cwmyoy.

Arrangements

Cars will meet at 9.30am for 10.00 am at the forestry parking - What3Words ///vase.incensed.snips or OS map ref. (SO 30762215). Directions from Hereford: take A465 south from Hereford for 15 miles. Turn right for Llanvihangell Crucorney and after 1 mile, by the Skirrid Inn, turn right for Cwmyoy. After 2 miles turn left (very near the Queen's Head pub on the right) onto a narrow lane for 2 furlongs and park at the Y junction to forest track. We will then take a few cars up a rougher road to (SO 2962220) and walk up a gentle ascent of at least 70 metres to one of the best viewpoints around. Bring your own refreshments, suitable walking boots and poles, binoculars and notebooks. We should end the trip at approximately 5.00 pm.

FIELD MEETING No.4

SATURDAY 21 JUNE 2025

Coningsby Hospital / Museum and Blackfriars monastic remains, Hereford.

Tucked away behind a seventeenth-century doorway in Widemarsh Street lie two of Hereford's largely unseen historical gems: Coningsby Hospital and, behind it, the site of the ruins of the Blackfriars Monastery. Both lie adjacent to a beautiful rose garden. The first part of the afternoon will consist of a tour of the remains of the refectory, friar's house and preaching cross – the only such extant example in England and originally located in the friars' cemetery. This will be followed by an inspection of the courtyard of the almshouses, and a brief talk on their construction. One of the residents has kindly agreed to open her house for small-group tours of her premises. A talk will then be given in the chapel by Peter Harris, the chairman of the Coningsby trustees, to whom we are indebted. There will be an opportunity afterwards to look around the museum before afternoon tea in the courtyard (or chapel if wet).
