That your petitioners hearing that a Bill has lately passed the House of Commons for makeing the rivers of Wye and Lugg navigable at the County of Hereford's charge and that thereby the Iron works, Mills, weares and Locks were to be bought in at the County's charge

That your petitioners who live on the hither side of the county of Hereford carry most of their corne to Gloucester citty and have noe occasion for the said River but on the contrary our estates and prises of our Corne will be lessened by the navigation

Your petitioners therefore most humbly pray that the Estates in these severall parishes may be exempted from contributing to the charge of makeing the said rivers navigable for that they shall not have any advantage by the same and that in case your Lordshipps shall determine us to bear our proportion of the Charge That then the owners of Weares may be obliged to build locks and to repair them at their own charge That so the charge of the navigating the said Rivers may bee much to ?ended and easier made navigable.

And your petitioners as in duty bound shall ever pray etc
